NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000 GO URBAN RENEWAL BONDS: Issuance Public Hearing - Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Baier to open the public hearing for the issuance of the \$5,000,000 GO Urban Renewal Bonds at 9:15 a.m. No comments were received by the Auditor, Supervisors, or public. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Baier to close the public hearing at 9:16 a.m. Additional Action Resolution - Moved by Baier and seconded by Hoadley to approve Resolution #2024-35 - Resolution Instituting Proceedings to Take Additional Action for The Issuance Of Not To Exceed \$5,000,000 General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds. WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by law, the Board of Supervisors has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to institute proceedings for the issuance of not to exceed \$5,000,000 General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, for essential county urban renewal purposes, in order to provide funds to pay the costs of aiding in the planning, undertaking, and carrying out of urban renewal projects under the authority of chapter 403 including P33 Resurfacing - P33 from Hwy 92 to Union County and Grading & Paving - 290th St. from P33 west to the Henry A. Wallace Country Life Center as authorized in Amendment No. 2 to the Adair County Northwest Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan, and has considered the extent of objections received from residents or property owners as to the proposed issuance of Bonds; and no petition was filed calling for a referendum thereon. The following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof. Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Board Of Supervisors Of Adair County, State Of Iowa: Section 1. That this Board does hereby institute proceedings and take additional action for the authorization and issuance in the manner required by law of not to exceed \$5,000,000 General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, for the foregoing essential county urban renewal purposes. Section 2. This Resolution shall serve as a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2 and shall be maintained on file as a public record of such intent. It is reasonably expected that the general fund moneys may be advanced from time to time for capital expenditures which are to be paid from the proceeds of the above Bonds. The amounts so advanced shall be reimbursed from the proceeds of the Bonds not later than eighteen months after the initial payment of the capital expenditures or eighteen months after the property is placed in service. Such advancements shall not exceed the amount authorized in this Resolution unless the same are for preliminary expenditures or unless another declaration of intention is adopted. Advertisement, Electronic Bids, and Official Statement Resolution- Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Baier to approve Resolution #2024-36 - Resolution Directing the Advertisement for Sale Of \$5,000,000 (Dollar Amount Subject To Change) General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, Series 2024. And Approving Electronic Bidding Procedures And Official Statement. WHEREAS, the Issuer is in need of funds to pay costs of aiding in the planning, undertaking, and carrying out of urban renewal projects under the authority of chapter 403 including P33 Resurfacing - P33 from Hwy 92 to Union County and Grading & Paving - 290th St. from P33 west to the Henry A. Wallace Country Life Center as authorized in Amendment No. 2 to the Adair Country Northwest Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan, essential county urban renewal purpose project(s), and it is deemed necessary and advisable that the County issue General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, for such purpose(s) to the amount of not to exceed \$5,000,000 as authorized by Sections 331.443 and 403.12 of the Code of Iowa; and WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by Sections 331.443 and 403.12 this Board has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to institute proceedings for the issuance of said Bonds, and all objections, if any, to such Board action made by any resident or property owner of the County were received and considered by the Board; and no petition having been filed, it is the decision of the Board that additional action be taken for the issuance of said Bonds for such purpose(s), and that such action is considered to be in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof; and WHEREAS, in conjunction with its Municipal Advisor, Speer Financial, Inc., the County has caused an Official Statement to be prepared outlining the details of the proposed sale of the Bonds; and WHEREAS, the Board has received information from its Municipal Advisor evaluating and recommending the procedure hereinafter described for electronic, facsimile and internet bidding to maintain the integrity and security of the competitive bidding process and to facilitate the delivery of bids by interested parties; and WHEREAS, the Board deems it in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof to receive bids to purchase such Bonds by means of both sealed and electronic internet communication. Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Board Of Supervisors Of Adair County, State Of Iowa: That the receipt of electronic bids by facsimile machine and through the SpeerAuction Competitive Bidding System described in the Notice of Sale and Official Statement are hereby found and determined to provide reasonable security and to maintain the integrity of the competitive bidding process, and to facilitate the delivery of bids by interested parties in connection with the offering at public sale. That General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, Series 2024, of Adair County, State of Iowa, in the amount of \$5,000,000 (Dollar Amount Subject to Change), to be issued as referred to in the preamble of this Resolution, to be dated June 13, 2024, be offered for sale pursuant to the published advertisement. That the preliminary Official Statement in the form presented to this meeting be and the same hereby is approved as to form and deemed final for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, subject to such revisions, corrections or modifications as the Chairperson and County Auditor, upon the advice of bond counsel and the County's Municipal Advisor, shall determine to be appropriate, and is authorized to be distributed in connection with the offering of the Bonds for sale. That the Auditor is hereby directed to publish notice of sale of the Bonds at least once, the last one of which shall be not less than four clear days nor more than twenty days before the date of the sale. Publication shall be made in the "The Adair County Free Press", a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, published within the county in which the Bonds are to be offered for sale or an adjacent county. The notice is given pursuant to Chapter 75 of the Code of Iowa, and shall state that this Board, on the 15th day of May, 2024, at 10:30 A.M., will hold a meeting to receive and act upon bids for said Bonds, which bids were previously received and opened by County Officials at 10:00 A.M. on said date. Vendors will be located on the Courtyard and the restrooms will not be used.

PUBLIC HEARING – 292nd AVENUE: Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Baier to open the public hearing at 9:30 a.m. Rich Hall voiced his concerns regarding 292nd Avenue being vacated and asked the Board to not close the road and to continue to maintain it. The Board, Engineer, and Hall discussed the options for the road. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Hoadley to close the public hearing at 9:46 a.m. Hall exited at 9:46 a.m. **Resolution –** Moved by Walker and seconded by Baier to approve **Resolution #2024-37 –** WHEREAS, a public hearing was conducted on May 01, 2024, at 9:30 am following publication and service of notice as required by law on the proposed vacation and closure of a portion of county secondary road, described as follows: That portion of "292nd Ave.", of which a previous record of establishment or petition could not be determined, commencing at a point located 1155 feet southwesterly of the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 8, Township 74 North, Range 33 West of the 5th P.M., said point also known to be the intersection point of observed 292nd Ave. and Bridgewater Rd. thence in a southwesterly direction along the observed centerline of 292nd Ave., a distance of 1100.00 feet. WHEREAS, an extensive review of County road records did not indicate whether the above described portion of 292nd Ave. had previously been established as a County Road therefore the above described dimensions and alignment of the roadway are based on observed measurements.
