PUBLIC HEARING – VACATE PORTION OF ADAIR-CASS AVENUE: Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Wedemeyer to open the joint public hearing with Cass County to vacate a portion of the Adair-Cass Avenue at 9:05 a.m. Approved. Cass County opened their public hearing. No comments were received by the Adair County Engineer's office or Supervisors. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Walker to close the public hearing at 9:09 a.m. Approved. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Walker to approve Resolution #2025-19 – Resolution to Vacate a Road. WHEREAS, a joint public hearing was conducted on March 18, 2025, at 9:05 AM following publication and service of notice as required by law on the proposed vacation and closure of a portion of Adair/Cass County Secondary road. WHEREAS, the proposed road vacation is located along the Adair – Cass County line and can be described as recorded in Adair County records as follows: That portion of "Adair-Cass Avenue", established June 7th, 1882 (See Adair County Road Record Book 3, Page 195), commencing at the point known as the point of intersection of Adair-Cass Avenue and the southern right-of-way limits of 350th St., point also known as being 33 feet south of the northwest corner of Section 6, Township 77 North, Range 33 West of the 5th Principal Meridian, thence running southerly along the west line of said Section 6, a distance of about 2034 ft. All remaining portions of Adair-Cass Avenue located within said Section 6 are known to be previously vacated or closed. WHEREAS, Any and all objections that have been received, either in writing or by persons present have been discussed and resolved requiring no further action by Adair or Cass County. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Adair Board of Supervisors that the subject section of road be ordered vacated and closed in Adair County, lowa. Roll call vote: Christoffersen, aye; Walker, aye; Hoadley aye, Baier, aye; and Wedemeyer, aye. Approved.

**LIQUOR LICENSE – 5 DAY:** Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Hoadley to approve the 5-day temporary liquor license for Lucky Wife Wine Slushies effective April 3, 2025. Approved. Hansen exited 9:11 a.m. Stacie Eshelman entered 9:12 a.m.

**SIGN LIFE INSURANCE AGREEMENT:** Moved by Walker and seconded by Christoffersen for the chair to sign the Life Insurance Agreement with Madison National Life Insurance Company. Hoadley, nay. Approved.

**MANURE MANAGEMENT PLAN UPDATES:** Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Walker to acknowledge receipt of the manure management plan updates from Circle G Farms, Robert Slayton, Steel Land & Livestock, and Linda Van Eaton. Approved.

**APPOINT VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMISSIONER:** After the resignation of Commissioner Lucas Queck, the Veterans' Affairs Commission would recommend the appointment of Steven Jorgensen to fill out Queck's vacancy. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Wedemeyer to appoint Steven Jorgensen as the third Veterans' Affairs Commissioner. Approved.

**CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION GRANT DRAW DOWN:** Moved by Walker and seconded by Wedemeyer for Mandy Berg, as contract administrator, to sign the child abuse prevention grant draw downs for January and February. Approved.

**BONNIE & CLYDE RUN:** Brenda Dudley, White Pole Road, discussed the Bonnie and Clyde Run that will happen on Saturday, April 26, 2025. There will be no closing of roads, but have people on all intersections to direct traffic. They have added an 18 mile bike ride. Moved by Walker and seconded by Hoadley to acknowledge notice of the Bonnie and Clyde Run. Approved. Jeff Vandewater and Heath Hove entered at 9:17 a.m.

**COURTYARD USE PERMITS:** Stacie Eshelman, Main Street Greenfield discussed the four permits submitted. Insurance does change in April but insurance will send the County a copy of the new policy. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Walker to approve the courtyard use permits for April 19, 2025 for the Easter Egg Hunt, May 21, 2025 for the Tornado Commemoration, June 5, 2025 through October 16, 2025 for the Farmer's Market, and July 3, 2025 through July 4, 2025 for the Fourth of July Celebration. Approved. Eshelman exited at 9:20 a.m.

REPLACING ISICS TOWER: Captain Heath Hove, lowa State Patrol and Jeff Vandewater, County Sheriff discussed the replacement of the ISICS. Sheriff Vandewater stated that there was a meeting last Monday with the Engineers for the reconstruction of the new communications tower that had been damaged in the tornado. The old tower's foundation and legs are not usable, so the plan is to move forty feet away from the existing tower and build a new one. Vandewater wanted to make sure the Board was ok with this before moving forward. It is still on the County's property and not near a property line. Captain Hove stated that the old tower would remain there until the new tower is constructed and everything is switched over. After, the old tower will be taken down. Engineer Kauffman was ok with leaving the footings as they are forty feet down as long as a fence was put around

them. Kauffman also would like to firm up the area where the cranes will be used. The State will pay for the new tower and the County's equipment that was damaged on the tower was covered by the County's insurance. The State also uses the County and it enhances everyone's communication. Sheriff Vandewater stated that the County would have been in a less advantageous position if we weren't on this system when the tornado occurred. Vandewater brought in the original agreement and thought that an amendment would need to be made and signed off on by the Supervisors. The project is planned to be completely done by the end of the year. Moved by Walker and seconded by Hoadley to allow Sheriff Vandewater and the State to proceed with the project. Approved.
